- e. What is School Council? Government-mandated organization made up of caregivers of children within the school, administration, teachers and school board trustee. School Council is to facilitate the well-being and academic growth of all students through the undertaking of discussions and activities that will foster engagement, collaboration and enhance the effectiveness of our school community.

2. Trustee's Report - Don Irwin

- a. Firstly let me welcome each of you back as each School Council, parent, student and staff play a half an important role in the education of our students and society. I hope you had a restful and relaxing summer and are recharged.
- b. Work for the board started on August 24 with our annual breakfast that we prepare and serve to all of the central office staff each year. Next that day we held our organizational meeting for the year and elected our officers. Cathy Allen from Sherwood Park and Susan Miller from rural Strathcona county were elected as the chair and vice chair. Thanks to Trina Boymook and Colleen Holowaychuk for their excellent service in these positions in the last number of years.
- c. The board has just returned from a two day retreat in Pigeon Lake where we reviewed the past year and set plans for the next year. We also updated our education plan and investigated new program ideas.
- d. Budget this year is a very tight budget as we have used most of our reserves from past years and now cannot accumulate much reserves to use for special projects.
- e. French Immersion we are currently compiling all the information from all of the public meetings and the survey done in late June and will be presenting the summary and the recommendation of how to continue promoting French Immersion in all grades. As space is limited in Ardrossan

- **b.** Beginning of Year Survey Results 105 surveys received this year compared to 27 last year. Results as follows:

 - Library Renewal 37 (35.2%)
 - Library Books 54 (51.4%)
 - Sensory Room 27 (25.7%)
 - Makerspace/Art Room 38 (36.2%)
 - Stone Learning Circle 14 (13.3%)
 - Sunshine Committee 18 (17.1%)
 - Music Room Resources 31 (29.5)
 - Physical Education Resources 58 (55.2%)
 - Chromebooks 61 (58.1%)
 - Cultural Performances 22 (21%)
 - Other: Whatever the school feels they need
 - ii. Parent engagement 26% of survey respondents said they had attended a parent engagement session, 21% no, 18% not my thing.

- When asked what they'd like to see sessions about, the results were:
 - Children's mental health 44%
 - How to help your struggling student at home 38%
 - Computer and tech safety 35%
- c. 2023 School Council Events & Initiatives
 - Book Fairs We are proposing to run two book fairs this year -October 25-26 and February. Both to run during parent teacher evenings.
 - ii. Teacher Appreciation Kya we like to organize lunch for the teachers on the days they have to stay late for parent teacher meetings. Pot Luck style with parents contributing the food.
 - iii. Family Game Night looking to make a committee. November 23. To run ourselves. Grade 6's to help prep.
 - iv. Learning Advisory Committee to help gather quotes, etc. "Learning Commons" - more than a library!
 - v. Sunshine Committee focusing on school care. Showing appreciation for staff, students, and volunteers. Support the purchase of snacks and food to be available in the office.
 - vi. Sensory Room Committee to provide input and recommendations for equipment for the sensory room. How is it used? Need to work with staff on making those decisions.
 - vii. Amy motioned to create committees for the four initiatives: Family Game Night, Learning Advisory, Sunshine, Sensory Room.
