9. School Council Old Business

- a. Learning Commons & Window Grating Update
 - i. Waiting for display shelves but there is a wait time for ordering and getting them in
 - ii. Diamond grating was inquired about whether it could be removed
 - Fire code requirements
 - Fall protection
 - Required for portables
 - Not on the list to be updated at this point
- b. School Council Engagement Grant Spending Update Risky Play
 - i. Sara Reader is coming from playful adventures
 - ii. Talking about risky play. Runs adventure playgrounds and loose parts play
 - iii. Parents and children are welcome
 - iv. May 10, 2024 from 6:00pm-8:00pm at Wes Hosford
- c. Self Regulation Room Update (Provided by Courtney)
 - i. Purchase order is finally approved
 - ii. Should arrive soon
 - iii. After exchange rate is finalized we'll know how much \$ is remaining from allocated budget.
- d. Sunshine Committee Update / Volunteer Appreciation Event
 - i. Administrative day
 - Purchased a planter for Terry
 - Cotton Candy funds donated to the sunshine committee were spent on a blanket and Lululemon gift card for Ms. Pasma
 - Teachers week had a group of volunteers come in to clean the gym, maker space, photocopying
 - Principal and Vice Principal lunch
 - Volunteer appreciation lunch on June 13 with appies provided. Official invites are coming
- e. ASCA Conference and COSC Update
 - i. Minister of Education took questions from the floor. Everyone was respectful
 - ii. Spoke a lot about numbers. And said most recent numbers being shared but Alberta is still likely the lowest-funded province
 - iii. Cell phones- 1,300 parents had provided feedback on the curriculum survey and already at 38,000 parent responses regarding cell phones
 - iv. Acknowledged that parents have a large role in their child's education. Question regarding funding for qualified staff with information going back to the school board. Minister's stance is that funds are there for the division already.

v. Alberta offers world-class education. Was challenged about how that would continue if education wasn't funded.

NOTE: Parent voice is very strong. If an email is sent to the Minister, please cc your School Board Trustee and the political opposition. Parent emails have a large impact.

10. School Budget 2024-2025 Presentation

- a. Classroom Configuration
 - Some things are in the control of Administration and some things are not.
 - 95% of budget must be spent on staffing no more or less
 - Compare what was spent last year with whether it's required
 - 295 students are enrolled
 - o 24 students are required to pay for a teacher
 - o Can't combine students evenly across the school either (higher number of students in div. 2 and lesser number of students in div 1)
 - 1 combined class this year
 - 3 combined classes next year
 - Split classes will be1/2 (Mrs. Chamczuk), 2/3 (Ms. Parker), 4/5 (Mrs. Gillis)
 - Won't be telling the kids in advance who is in their class
 - August 28 in the evening will be a meet the teacher where they can meet their teacher, bring their supplies and then start school on August 29

11. Council New Business

- a. Playground Pour-in-Place Survey Results
 - i. Playground project was taken on by Kilby
 - Received grant and a budget of \$250,000 with \$125,000 for equipment
 - County suggested changing the playground footprint by not removing the outdoor classroom and the little forest
 - Sensory sidewalk with panels leading to disc swing. With all accessibility located closest to GARC parking lot
 - Ramp into the sand
 - County contacted Kilby
 - a. Told sensory walk wasn't feasible due to grading
 - b. Told pour in place is outside of budget
 - After further advocating, the sensory walk has been reintroduced
 - a. Told additional money cannot be added to budget
 - Received an email saying that if we can come up with \$33,000 this year, we can have the pour in place. If waiting for next year then cost will be \$40,000
 - Caregiver body was surveyed
 - a. 91 responses with a 60/40 discussion about the pour in place for the playground
 - Teacher perspective?
 - More accessible the playground is the more will use and enjoy and the more it builds community
 - Frustrating that inclusivity still seems to be an issue in present day

- Continue discussion and explore the potential to reallocate fundraising \$ to pay for the pour-in-place
 - ii. Loretta moved to continue discussion in fundraising
 - iii. Courtney seconded the motion.
