Hello everyone, welcome back to school! I hope you had a good holiday break.

In December, we wrapped up Understanding the Brain. Our last area of focus was learning how to calm our "Guard Dog" (our amygdala and brain stem). We did this by learning various breathing and focused attention practices that we will continue to use throughout the year.

I am looking forward to starting Self Awareness & Emotional Management with Kindergarten-Grade 3, where we will be diving deeper into our emotional responses and regulation.

In Grades 4-6, we will be starting the Relationships program, which will explore how to relate to others in a kind way, and how to maintain good connections with others.

Date: Starting Friday, January 17, 2025 (8 week program)



Inclement Weather

With the winter season well underway, we want to remind families to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.

If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will advise families of any bus cancellations using various communications tools—automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on www.eips.ca and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations and notification through both the Bus Status and the Ride 360 apps. Morning bus cancellations are posted on www.eips.ca by 6:30 a.m.



Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS' <u>Administrative Procedure 131:</u>
<u>Inclement Weather</u>, which states: "school bus service may be suspended ... when there is a forecast or current temperature of -40 C including wind chill, in one or more regions."

Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and poor road conditions.

When school bus services are suspended, schools remain open to students. EIPS believes families have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on what they feel is safest during times of inclement weather.
